APAVM 2025 TRIP HIGHLIGHTS

KAGOSHIMA

- Monument of St Francis Xavier which commemorates the 1549 landing of Francis Xavier, marking the establishment of the first Christian mission in Japan
- Cathedral of St Francis Xavier, a testament to the work of the Spanish missionary who attempted to bring Christianity to Japan
- Kirishima Open Air Museum, a 20ha open air art museum at the foothills of Kirishima at an elevation of 700m above sea level

NAGASAKI


- Oura Cathedral where Kakure Kirishitans, descendants of early Japanese Christians who went into hiding were discovered more than 200 years later in the 19th Century
- Reconstructed Urakami Cathedral, the largest Christian structure in Asia Pacific until its destruction in 1945 by the atomic bomb that fell on Nagasaki
- Twenty-Six Martyrs Museum and Monument commemorating the canonization of the Christians executed in 1597 on the order of Toyotomi Hideyoshi.
- Reconstructed Shimabara Castle and symbol of Shimabara Christian rebellion in 17th Century when 37,000 Christians were executed, mostly by beheading, but some were thrown alive into nearby natural boiling waters.
- Model of Dejima, a man-made island in the port of Nagasaki, constructed in 1636 to segregate Portuguese from the Japanese and control their missionary activities. After the Portuguese were expelled from Japan, the Dutch were restricted to Dejima during Japan's two centuries of isolation as the only remaining Westerners allowed in the country.
- The Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum is in the city of Nagasaki, Japan. The museum is a remembrance of the atomic bombing of Nagasaki by the United States on 9 August 1945 at 11:02:35 am.

GOTO ISLANDS

- Dozaki Church, built by French missionaries, is the oldest church in the Goto islands. It now serves as a museum displaying historical documents relating to Christians and the 300-year period of suppression of Christianity in Japan.
- Christians' Cave where Christians hid themselves in a 50m-deep cave onlyaccessible by boat. They were discovered, arrested and tortured when a passing boat saw smoke from their cooking fire.


"Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,




